Objectives of the B.A.A. program with major in Management Information Systems (MIS):

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WORK TERM 1 2 nd year completed: <i>under</i> <i>supervision</i>	 Student has a good knowledge of IS and the objectives of the business core functions, and should therefore be able to: differentiate among the main types of IS used in the business and participate in their development or evolution from the functional and decision-making points of view; use various information management software, such as the Microsoft Office suite; work in the Microsoft Visual Studio .Net object-oriented development environment; and perform systems programming in different languages (junior-level). OBJECTIVES: allow the student to participate in the development or evolutionary process of the business's IS and to use various software to manage the business' daily activities. 		
WORK TERM 2 3 rd year completed: <i>under</i> <i>supervision and/or periodic</i> <i>assistance</i>	 Student has a deeper knowledge of IS, and should therefore be able to: work in the Microsoft Visual Studio .Net object-oriented development environment or other development environments; perform systems programming in different languages (intermediate-level); design, develop and manage Internet, Intranet or Extranet sites that meet the business's objectives; analyze the business's information system and technology (IT) needs; perform the detailed analysis underlying the development of a new IS; participate in the development of new IS or the evolution of existing IS; and apply new IT trends in the business. OBJECTIVES: allow the student to analyze and understand the business's needs in relation to IS and IT, and participate actively in the development of new IS or the evolution of existing IS. 		
WORK TERM 3 4 th year completed: <i>under</i> <i>supervision with a certain</i> <i>autonomy</i>	 Student has a superior knowledge of IS, and should therefore be able to: analyze IS and IT performance in the business so that to propose any necessary improvements, or the replacement of some existing IS or IT; be part of project teams developing or improving IS, or implementing new IT in the business; study and propose solutions leading to more efficient and effective management of the business using IS and IT; develop IS and IT project management skills; and be aware of professional integrity and ethics. OBJECTIVES: make the student ready to assume positions as IS professionals in different types of business.
