

Keynote Speaker: Gordon Porter, C.M., O.N.-B., LL.D.

Gordon Porter is the director of Inclusive Education Canada, an initiative of the Canadian Association for



Community Living. He is also a former chairperson of the New Brunswick Human Rights Commission. He was director of Student Services for the schools in the Woodstock area, after serving as a teacher and principal in several New Brunswick schools. He finished his teaching career as a professor of Education at the University of Maine in Presque Isle. Dr. Porter is an internationally known expert on inclusive education who has consulted, lectured, and conducted training in numerous countries around the world—most recently in Spain, Dubai, Portugal, Colombia and Peru. He was invited to make an 'expert' presentation to the United Nations Human Rights Committee in Geneva. In August 2009, Dr. Porter received an Honorary Doctorate from the National Pedagogical University of Peru in recognition of his work on inclusive education in that country. Porter has guided the development of policy on inclusive education in New Brunswick, North West Territories, Dubai and Nova Scotia. He

has edited two books and written numerous articles on inclusive education. In recognition of his long career of distinguished service, he was awarded the Order of Canada in 2010 and the Order of New Brunswick in 2013.
