If you are a graduate from a Canadian French Immersion program, you are not required to take a French proficiency test, as we believe that you have all the necessary tools to succeed, in accompaniment with our added support.

Not in a French Immersion program? To be admitted to the Groupe-Pont program, your French speaking and comprehension skills need to be evaluated. During your required meeting, Isabelle will perform this assessment. In a brief 15-minute conversation, she will assess your oral French skills and tell you if you are a suitable candidate.

For those wishing to bypass the Groupe-Pont program, a written evaluation is required.

Study Medicine at UMoncton

An undergraduate medical (M.D.) program is offered on campus by the *Centre de formation médicale du Nouveau-Brunswick* in partnership with the Université de Sherbrooke. Each year 28 seats are available to NB students, 3 for NS students and 1 for PEI students. French Immersion candidates are eligible for these seats. Your degree will be granted by the Université de Sherbrooke in Quebec through its delocalized program.

As a fast-track towards this program, UMoncton offers a two-year **Health Sciences Diploma (Pre-Med)** program — a degree held by the majority of medical students at the CFMNB.



Candidates from other provinces and countries must have received an education that is judged to be equivalent by the Admission Committee. Courses judged to be equivalent to those indicated will be considered for admission. In certain cases, the Admission Committee may consider a student who does not meet the usual language admission requirement (grade 12 French language course). French training may be specified as a requirement for undertaking studies at UMoncton.

Recognition of International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement courses:

UMoncton values the high standards of International Baccalaureate (IB) and Advanced Placement (AP) courses. Credits will be given for higher level courses deemed to be the equivalent of courses offered at UMoncton when the student's mark is 4/7 or higher on the IB exam or 3/5 or higher on the AP exam.

Automatic Scholarships

These scholarships will automatically be offered to any applicant who meets the eligibility criteria. Some of these scholarships are offered exclusively to French Immersion students. Be sure to read the eligibility criteria carefully.


