

# JOB POSTING 2019 Articling Student Positions

#### Overview

Calgary Legal Guidance (CLG) is a charitable society established in 1972 to provide legal advice and assistance to low-income people with family, criminal, immigration, civil and other poverty law matters that are not covered by Legal Aid.

Over 4,000 clients are assisted each year through community legal advice clinics staffed by volunteer lawyers, with follow-up help and representation provided by the staff lawyers, social advocates, articling students and, during the summer months, law students. CLG is also committed to public legal education through presentations in the community and through partnerships with many agencies and organizations that assist the disadvantaged.

CLG promotes employment equity and diversity. We provide a healthy work-life balance that values the contribution of all staff. CLG also provides a healthy, respectful and enjoyable work environment.

#### The Role

CLG is currently offering three (3) articling student positions for the 2019/20 year, beginning in July, 2019. CLG seeks candidates who are committed to improving access to justice. CLG students represent and provide assistance to individuals with legal issues related to domestic violence, homelessness, criminal justice, seniors' issues, social benefits and immigration law. This includes significant time appearing in & preparing submissions for courts & administrative tribunals. Applicants should demonstrate an ability to manage time well, take instruction and work in a team atmosphere as well as independently. Excellent research skills as well as a high degree of competency in interviewing, client management, and advocacy (both oral and written) are required.

### **Required Qualifications**

Eligibility for membership with the Law Society of Alberta as a student-at-law at the time articles are to commence. Please review the rules of the Law Society of Alberta to ensure you are eligible prior to submitting an application for this competition.

Preference will be given to candidates with some experience in public interest/poverty law and litigation.
