UNIVERSITÉ DE MONCTON'S VISUAL ARTS DEPARTMENT GRADUATES SHOW



Moncton, March 30 2011 – From April 16 to May 29 2011, the Galerie d'art Louise et Reuben-Cohen presents an exhibition of works by Université de Moncton's graduating visual art students. The opening will be held on Thursday, April 21, between 7 and 9 PM, with the graduating students in attendance.

Seven graduating students will be presenting their work. Jessica Arseneau, of Tilley-Road, is interested in the body as the element through which the environment is understood. Rémi Belliveau was born in Dieppe, but grew up in Memramcook, an area still present in his current conceptual-based work. Christine Brideau is originally from St-Sauveur. Through installation and painting, she creates a happy world that acts as an escape from day-to-day reality. Jessie Goulet, from La Pocatière, in Québec, proposes her vision of an annihilating society dependant on consumerism in the form of sculptures and installations. Sara LeBlanc, originally from LaPlante,

composes from photographic-based memories that she transforms into imaginary spaces. **Jean-Denis Mignault** is originally from the Edmundston region. He is interested in the subversive appropriation of symbols in his print and photography-based works. **Louise Thériault**, of St-Léolin, explores the relationships between close relatives in an installation that recalls the family tree.

The exhibition also includes the work of two invited students. **Christine Comeau** is originally from the Acadie-Bathurst region. Concentrating on Photography as part of a multidisciplinary degree, she explores the worlds of fashion and fairy tales. **Travis Melanson**, of Shediac, is studying Biology. Courses in sculpture and ceramics at the Visual arts department have enabled him to bring imaginary creatures to life.
