**LES DÉLINQUANT(E)S DE 2013 : UNIVERSITÉ DE MONCTON
FINE ARTS GRADUATES' SHOW**



Moncton, March 28 2012 – The Louise and Reuben Cohen Art Gallery presents an exhibition of works by Université de Moncton's graduating fine arts students. The opening will be held on **Friday, April 12, between 7 and 9 PM**, with the eight graduating students presenting their work in attendance:

Adèle Boudreau (Isle Madame) explores the link between reality and the metaphysical world in her ceramic work.

In painting as in printmaking, **Néomie DesRoches** (Tracadie-Sheila) is interested in memory and how it is intrinsically linked to the construction of personal histories.

Kate Hull (Truro) works in printmaking and proposes social comments on current, historical, scientific and political issues.

Josette Martin (St-Ignace) solicits intrigue with photographic interpretations of objects disposed in intimate surroundings.

Working with ceramic and photography, **François McLaughlin** (Petit-Rocher) is inspired by anecdotes and memories, exploring the effects of the passage of time.

In painting, **Angie Richard** (Cap-Pelé) is interested in the development of individuality and opens a dialogue between personal identity and «attributed» identities in her photography.

M.L. Josée Robichaud (Sackville) articulates how memories can be manipulated and transformed by the subconscious mind in painting and printmaking.

Melissa Rogers (Moncton) looks at desire and relationships in painting, and issues related to self-image in her photography.

The exhibition will be presented until May 26. The Louise and Reuben Cohen Art Gallery is located at 405 Université Avenue, in the Clément Cormier building on the Université de Moncton campus. Gallery hours are 1 PM to 4:30 PM, Tuesday to Friday, and 1 PM to 4 PM on Saturday and Sunday. Admission is free.
