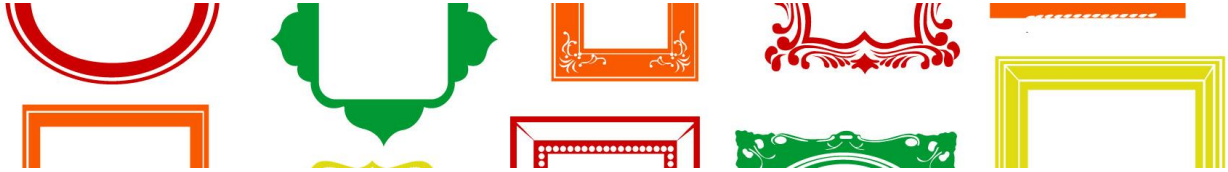

## AN INVENTORY: A CLOSER LOOK AT THE COLLECTION



**Moncton, November 30 2015** – *An Inventory: handle, count, measure, photograph, catalogue, reveal, discuss, situate, compare...*

*An Inventory* is a project that offers an opportunity for its managers, but also for artists, curators, researchers and the public to explore the Galerie d'art Louise-et-Reuben-Cohen Collection. Between December 2015 and March 2016, the exhibition spaces will be dedicated to hosting a multitude of projects aimed at fostering knowledge and a better understanding of this collection, as a whole, in parts, by way of a particular perspective; all possibilities of approaches enabling discovery.

Presented in parallel to a process of identification, documentation, and conservation that will be the focus of the gallery's team over this period, activities are proposed in order to engage other interested individuals:

- Residencies by artists, curators, writers, and any other researchers proposing research or creative projects will be facilitated. These will be short term residencies, either of a few consecutive weeks, or many days spread over the three months, according to the scope of the proposals.
- A workshop on artwork documentation will be directed by Mathieu Léger on Saturday, January 16, from noon to 4 PM. This workshop will focus on lighting, framing and digital editing for accurate documentation using basic tools. The participants will subsequently contribute to the documentation of parts of the collection.
- Conferences and public presentations of the projects will be held during the process.
